# **Getting to know Chilliwack's Species at Risk**

Species at risk profile: Barn Owl, Tyto alba

### What it looks and sounds like:

A medium-sized slender owl (up to 37 cm tall) with a distinctive, heart-shaped face, white and brown speckled body and relatively long wings. Its call is a <u>screech and high-pitched tweets</u>. <u>Click here for more identification details</u>.

#### Where it lives:

It can be seen flying over low elevation fields, pastures and roadsides at dusk. Trees, barns, old buildings, or other covered structures are used for nesting and roosting. <u>Visit this map for location</u> details.

#### What it eats:

A predator that mostly hunts rodents, particularly voles.

### What are its main threats in the Fraser Valley?

Loss of nesting sites and habitat. Rodenticide poisoning.

### Did you know?

- Scientific name means 'white owl'.
- An environmentally friendly form of pest control in agricultural areas.
- Will use human-made nest boxes.
