1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Attrill called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

3. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

5. NEW BUSINESS TO ADDRESS

Chair Attrill started off the meeting with round table introductions. Carol Marleau presented to the Committee, for their information, the request from the Bookman to do a selfie mural on their building downtown. The mural was approved but they were encouraged to contact the BIA as they too are undertaking this type of project. Chair Attrill would like Kylie Williams from the BIA to do a presentation on the Selfie Mural Project for the new members of the committee.

The next agenda item was the Street Banner Program and Chair Attrill asked Carol to discuss where things were at. Carol met with the BIA and CEPCO to make sure what they were doing aligns with the City Street Banner Program as much as possible. Questions were raised on getting companies to sponsor the banners or promote events. Promoting for events would be difficult as banners would have to be changed. Chair Attrill would look into who can sponsor or endorse them. The proposed budget is \$15,000 and there are approximately 150 brackets It was discussed on trying to keep them art focus and not event based.

The banners are proposed to be changed every year and be themed based. The CPAAC will decide at the next meeting what theme and color to go with. Carol was directed to research size and cost of banners as well as the cost of installation. Chair Attrill asked for update on the farm equipment for the roundabouts. Carol advised that they have obtained the mower and the big tractor and met with Public Works. Public Works are on board with placing the equipment and will attempt to take out the motor then planting flowers inside. They will also angle the tractor on the Prairie Central-Prest Roundabout to give it a more whimsical look. Marko suggested adding another element to the display such as a rearview mirror which would suggest looking at the past and into the future. Chair Attrill let the committee know that we are going ahead with this project as it has already been approved and the committee can explore other options with upcoming projects.

The final item on the agenda was the addition of the Vedder Bridge graffiti. Carol handed out pictures of the graffiti under the bridge and asked if there should be a call out for commission for a mural. Taryn suggested multiple artist as in Vancouver they have a Mural Fest. Chair Attril wants to send out a RFP as soon as possible and asked the committee about a theme such as a river theme.

6. INFORMATION / DISCUSSION

Round table discussions included Patrick asking about installation of public art at the Lickman Road exit. The Committee also discussed and defined what the public realm is in regards to public art, whether it is just outside or includes inside. The new brewery also was discussed and Michael Hamilton-Clark asked if they would have to come through the committee for any murals on their walls. Chair Attrill to look into it.
