1. CALL TO ORDER

4. NEW BUSINESS TO ADDRESS

Terms of Reference

- Guest speaker Jamie Leggatt (Director of Communications) reviewed the Terms of Reference with the committee in a brief presentation.

Real Estate Institute of BC Article

- Carol Marleau mentioned that the committee has been asked to create an article for the Spring 2021 edition of the Real Estate Institute of BC which should contain 1200-2000 words and include public art pictures. Councillor Knott will prepare the article.
- Since the article will be talking about where Chilliwack has come from and where it's going, the committee discussed including photos of the most monumental public art in Chilliwack. Some suggestions included the CADREB sculpture outside the Chilliwack Cultural Centre and the Spring Flowers mural done by Central Elementary located downtown. It was also suggested that the article could direct the public to the online public art catalogue.

Online Public Art Catalogue Partnership with Tourism Chilliwack

- Carol Marleau informed the committee that the online public art catalogue is in progress and is not ready at this time. She also mentioned that a walking map will be available in Spring 2021 and would look similar to the Parks & Trails map on Tourism Chilliwack's website.
- The committee discussed what items should be added to the online catalogue (which included the Piper Richardson Memorial Statue and the Canada 150 Mural) and would consist of City approved public art pieces

Lickman Road Roundabout Proposed Design

- Carol Marleau said she met with Engineering staff to discuss the proposed design of the public art being place at the Lickman Roundabout to ensure it would not be hazardous or distracting to drivers. The project will go out as an Expression of Interest.
- The committee discussed possible themes for the art piece such as the future of Chilliwack or the historical past. Suggestions included 3D pieces which are tall, such as a weather vane or sundial, which could be seen from the highway. An art piece with reflective moving pieces was suggested however it could be a distraction to drivers.
- The committee ended up agreeing on a future theme with the piece being 3D, tall and kinetic.
- Carol Marleau wrapped up the conversation informing the committee that the Request for Expression of Interest will require the following of the piece:
 - Multi-cultural
 - Future of Chilliwack
 - 3D
 - Tall (viewable from the highway)
 - Movable
 - Dynamic

Chair Knott mentioned that on November 19, at the Mount Cheam Rotary meeting, herself and Carol Marleau will be making a presentation about public art from all over the world.
