Bylaw No. 4574

A bylaw to implement a Municipal Ticketing System

WHEREAS Sections 264 and 265 of the *Community Charter* authorizes Council, by bylaw, to:

- (1) Designate those bylaws which may be enforced by means of a form of ticket prescribed by regulation;
- (2) Designate Bylaw Enforcement Officers for the purpose of enforcing bylaws by means of a prescribed form of ticket;
- (3) Designate an offence against a bylaw by means of a word or expression on a ticket; and,
- (4) Set fines not greater than the amount prescribed by regulation;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Chilliwack in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

CITATION

1. This bylaw may be cited as “**Municipal Ticket Information Bylaw 2018, No. 4574**”.

REPEAL

2. “Municipal Ticket Information Bylaw 2004, No. 3003” and amendments thereto are hereby repealed.

ENFORCEMENT

3. The bylaws, which shall include any amendment thereto, as listed in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Bylaw may be enforced by means of a ticket in the form prescribed for the purpose of Section 264 of the *Community Charter*.
4. The persons appointed to the job positions or titles listed in Column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Bylaw are designated as Bylaw Enforcement Officers pursuant to Section 1(b) of the *Community Charter* for the purpose of enforcing the bylaws listed in Column 1 of Schedule 1 opposite the respective job positions.
5. The words or expressions set forth in Column 1 of Schedule 2 of this bylaw designate the offence committed under the bylaw section number appearing in Column 2 opposite the respective words or expressions.

ENFORCEMENT (continued)

6. The amounts appearing in Column 3 of the Appendices to Schedule 1 of this Bylaw are the fines set pursuant to Sections 265(1)(a) and (b) of the *Community Charter* for the corresponding offences designated in Column 1.
7. This Bylaw shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.
