There are many different kinds of wild animals living in British Columbia. We can live peacefully with all animals by avoiding **human-wildlife conflict**. These situations could cause harm to both people and wildlife. One way to do this is to **reduce animal attractants** around you.



An **animal attractant** is anything that smells good to a wild animal, like garbage, fruit, or grease.

5 Tips to Avoid Human-Wildlife Conflict in Your Community:

① Keep garbage, recycling and compost inside or in a secure location. Only put bins outside for pick up in the morning.

② Bird feeders attract rodents and other wild animals. Keep the area clean or remove feeders.

③ Always clean your barbeque and clean up after picnics.

④ Don't leave pets or pet food outside.

⑤ Pick fruit often and don't let it collect on the ground
